Revolutionary War Graves Form Instructions

The SAR hopes that you will submit burial information for Revolutionary War patriots even if some of the information or citations to documents are lacking. We are willing to record a grave as reported by an impartial or partial observer, noting that it is always subject to update or correction as new information comes available. Many of the older records already registered with the NSSAR are incomplete or are in need of updating. Such updates are welcome and encouraged.

You must provide at least 1) the name of the person and 2) the county (or town) and state where the person is buried, died or applied for pension.

Please fill in the form (use legible writing or printing) with the information about the grave. Add a photo of the grave if you can. Please provide as accurate location or complete directions as possible so other researchers can find the grave. Please provide as much documentation as possible by noting references on the back of the form. Mail the completed form to the North Carolina SAR Graves Committee Chair:

Explanations

Service to the Revolution: List rank(s) or service and the state(s) in which he served. Include a reference to the source for this information.

Locations: List as much information as possible. For example, the city, township, county, and state (or foreign country). Provide complete directions and, if possible, a map, so others can find the grave.

Spouses: If the spouse was previously married write the name both before and after the previous marriages (if known)

References: If there are several references, put a number in parentheses next to the information, for example

-- Date of birth: April 2, 1758 (2) --
and then use that number in the reference list, for example

-- 2. Florida DAR Family Bible Project --

Note the full name of the book or other source of the information, as well as the date of publication and the number of the page on which the information was found. If the information was taken from the tombstone, say "from the tombstone". If the information (such as location of the grave) was based on a personal visit, say "personal visit".
